


KOPER-CAPODISTRIA










TUESDAY










FRIDAY










WHAT THE PARTICIPANTS SAID




Dear Kapodistrias


Life in the Venetian Republic, in the time Capodistrias studied in Padua (dress codes, meals and cuisine, entertainment, habits and customs).
